Use facial expressions.		<b>Voice Hunt</b> Call your baby's name from a distance so he can practice locating your voice.		<b>Out of Sight</b> Move a toy out of sight. Make a noise with it, and then return it.

<b>Rolling Over</b> Move a toy so that your baby will try to turn his body in order to keep the toy in sight.		<b>Show Feelings</b> Smile and laugh to show your feelings as you raise your baby and say up or lower your baby and say down.		<b>Turn and Find</b> Turn your baby so she will need to look behind her body to see a toy		<b>Ride a Horsie</b> Do a special action on the same one or two words in a rhyme and see if your baby notices		<b>Sitting, Turning, and Reaching</b> Hold toys in various positions to encourage your baby to stretch and reach for the toys.		<b>Mirror, Mirror</b> Touch and name parts of your bay's face as she looks in the mirror.		<b>Da-Da-Da</b> Imitate sounds that your baby makes, especially repeated sounds like da-da-da.

<b>Hiding and Finding</b> Invite your baby to look for an object that she watches you hide		<b>Dropping Objects</b> Invite your baby to practice dropping things, especially things that make a noise when they land.		<b>What comes next</b> Show your baby a familiar object and tell him what you are going to do with it		<b>Imitate Actions</b> Do some actions that your baby can copy		<b>Puzzle Play</b> You can invent a first puzzle for your baby by letting him put items in a muffin pan.		<b>Two Ways</b> Use a box with two homes to let your baby discover how to retrieve a toy that has gone out of reach		<b>Taste Game</b> Describe your baby's experience as she touches and tastes things.

Your baby will learn that hitting the toy will make a pleasant noise		<b>Holding and dropping</b> Offer toys that your baby can close her hand around. Encourage her to use her hands to grasp and release objects.		<b>Something Interesting</b> Hold your baby or place him where he can hold his head up and look at interest thing. Describe what you see.		<b>Following Directions</b> Give your toddler simple directions, like to pick, bring or find something.		<b>Hide and Seek</b> Play hide and seek (partially hide an object under a blanket and ask your baby to find it)
